



Prescribing of Stoma Leakage Notification Systems Position Statement

Hertfordshire and West Essex ICB <u>does not</u> support the prescribing of stoma leakage notification systems.

Recommendations

- Stoma leakage notification systems, e.g. Heylo™ System (starter kit and sensor layers) should not be prescribed.
- New and existing patients should be referred to their local stoma care nurse for review if they are experiencing problems with stoma bag leakage.
- If ordering in excess of <u>recommended stoma bag quantities</u>, patients should be referred to their local stoma care nurse for review.

Rationale

- Stoma leakage notification systems, e.g. Heylo™ system do not prevent leaks, but use sensors, a transmitter and an app to alert patients to signs of leakage.
- These devices are a lifestyle product and do not provide direct clinical benefit for the patient.
- Patients will be aware if their stoma bag is leaking as there may be a detectable odour, it may feel moist and the skin around the stoma may feel irritated.
- Patients experiencing regular leakage should be reviewed by their local stoma care nurse.
- The aim is to have such a good stoma bag fit that leaks do not occur, and stoma accessories are rarely needed.
- Using more than the recommended amount of stoma bags could indicate a stoma related issue that requires a clinical review.

Background

- Heylo™ is a digital leakage notification system for people with an ileostomy or colostomy with liquid or mushy output.
- Heylo™ system consists of sensors, transmitter and an app that alerts patients to signs of leakage.
- The sensor layer sits under the baseplate of the stoma bag.
- The Heylo™ app sends a notification to a smart phone before leakage can reach clothing (i.e. outside the baseplate).
